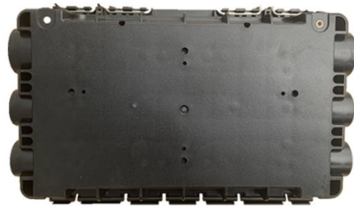


Spacing of horizontal cable tray mounting brackets
